- All information on this page is for the Open Horse Show on July 18, 2020.
- Stalls are available. Please call Brianne Brower at 307-749-3546 before noon on July 10, 2020 to reserve.
- This show is open to anyone wanting to participate. Entry fees will be \$10 per class with lead line class being \$5. Post entries will be accepted the day of the show at a fee of \$15 per class.
- All classes require at least three entries or the class will be canceled and the entry fee refunded.
- To ensure classes will be held, please mail, fax, email, or call in entries before noon on July 10, 2020.
- Exhibitors may add classes until one class before the current class in the arena. Classes will be ran in the order of the entry form.

RULES

- On Saturday, July 18 the show will start at 9:00AM with showmanship. Check with the show office and get your numbers prior to your first class of the day.
- Performance classes will be divided into four age groups: 10 and under (walk-trot only), 13 and under, 14-18, and 19 and over (adult).
- All contestants are expected to be present at the gate when their class is called. Gate holds can be requested; please contact the show staff ahead of time to request a gate hold. Three gate calls will be given.
- Horses must be shown by the person whose name appears on the entry form.
- All decisions concerning entries, rules, exhibitor conduct, or unsportsmanlike conduct will be made by the show judge or management.
- Western attire is required (western hat, long-sleeved shirt, and western style boots – no riding shoes). ASTM protective headgear is approved.
- If classes become too large for safety and judging ability, the judge is allowed to separate classes at their own discretion.

SHOWMANSHIP

- Only the showman is judged. The horse is merely a prop to show the ability of the showman.
- To be judged 80% on showing the horse (leading, posing, etc.), 10% on appearance of the horse (condition, grooming, etc.), 10% on appearance of the exhibitor.

WESTERN LEAD LINE

- Rider must be six years and under.
- Must be led by an adult, 18 and over.
- Must be in western attire.

WESTERN ATTIRE (For all western classes, unless otherwise stated).

- Western hat, long-sleeved shirt, western-style boots, bridle with standard western bit, split reins, neat and clean attire, good working attire.
- Optional: Chaps, spurs, romal tapaderos, slicker, rope, chain curb (at least one-half inch wide and must lie flat).

WESTERN HORSEMANSHIP

- Shown in western tack.
- Class judged on correct position and performance of the rider.
- Shown in the walk, trot, and lope both ways of the arena.
- The judge may ask for a pattern from the line up or have posted before classes.

WALK-TROT (W/T)

- **Children will perform only at a walk or trot. They cannot enter any other riding classes that require a lope.**
- The saddle should fit the child's size.
- ASTM protective headgear is encouraged.
- At the judge's discretion, classes may be divided for safety.
- The judge will provide a small, easy pattern for walk-trot classes.

WESTERN PLEASURE

- This class is judged on the performance of the horse at the discretion of the judge. Contestants will be penalized for excessive speed or being on the wrong lead.
- Horses under five years of age may use snaffle bit or bosal.
- Horses are to be shown at a walk, trot, and lope on a reasonably loose rein without undue restraint.
- Horses may work both ways of the ring at all three gaits to demonstrate their ability with different leads.
- Horses are to be reversed to the inside (away from the rail). They may be required to reverse at the walk or trot, at the discretion of the judge, but shall not be asked to reverse at the lope.
- The judge may ask that horses be backed.
- The judge may ask for additional work of the same nature from any of the horses.

JUNIOR HORSE WESTERN PLEASURE

- This class is limited to horses five years of age and younger that have never been shown in a shank bit.
- A snaffle bit (non-leveraged) or bosal must be used and the horse shall be ridden with two hands.
- The age of the horse shall be computed on the basis of a calendar year starting January 1 of the year foaled.
- May compete in all other classes.
- Once shown in a shank bit, you can never go back to a snaffle bit in any class.

TRAIL

- The pattern will be posted prior to the class.
- The class will be ran following junior horse western pleasure. It will not be open all day.

RANCH RIDING

- The pattern will be posted prior to the class.
- AQHA rules.

REINING

- The pattern will be posted prior to the class.
- Each contestant will perform the required pattern individually and separately. The horse shall rein and handle easily, fluently, effortlessly, and with reasonable speed throughout the pattern.
- Appointments the same as for Western Pleasure.
- Reins shall be held in one hand and cannot be changed during the ride. Only one finger is allowed between the reins.
- Rider's hands shall remain clear of the horse and saddle while in motion. Spurs or romal may not be used forward of the cinch.

FREESTYLE REINING
